Park Points of Interest

1. The Visitors Centre and Toilets

The building provides public and disabled toilets, a visitor room for displays and education, and acts as a maintenance depot when required.

2. The Pavilion

The Pavilion was constructed in 1857 when the park opened, and the statue of Sir Francis Crossley MP was added in 1860.

3. Carrara Marble Statue and Urns

The statues are copies of figures depicting mythological characters such as Hercules, Venus, Diana and Telemachus.

4. The Play Area

The play area is a dedicated zone for children.

5. The Sundial

The sundial was donated to the park by Alderman Matthew Smith in 1873, having earlier been created by a Mr. John Smith for a school in North Yorkshire.

6. The Central Fountain

The 'fish' fountain was donated in 1914 by Sir Francis Crossley's son and came from his home at Somerleyton.

7. Lake and Water Features

The serpentine pools flow through the park under the cast iron bridges. Aquatic plants and overhanging trees create a picturesque scene.

8. Cast-Iron Bridges with Halifax Coat of Arms Original cast iron bridges were repaired and reconstructed, three marble urns are now in place on one of the bridges.

9. Water Fountain

The water fountain was donated in 1859 by Mr. Joseph Thorp.

10. The Bandstand

Constructed in 1882 of cast iron, timber and zinc, refurbished in 2024, the bandstand has hosted many bands/entertainers over the years.
